Service Description

Substance Abuse Outpatient Care is the provision of outpatient services for the treatment of drug or alcohol use disorders. Service include:

- Screening
- Assessment
- Diagnosis, and/or
- Treatment of substance use disorder, including:
 - o Pretreatment/recovery readiness programs
 - o Harm reduction
 - o Behavioral health counseling associated with substance use disorder
 - o Outpatient drug-free treatment and counseling
 - o Medication assisted therapy
 - o Neuro-psychiatric pharmaceuticals
 - o Relapse prevention
 - Detoxification, if offered in a separate licensed residential setting (including a separately-licensed detoxification facility within the walls of a an inpatient medical or psychiatric hospital)

Program Guidance

Substance Abuse Services (residential) is permitted only when the client has received a written referral from the clinical provider as part of a substance use disorder treatment program funded under the RWHAP.

Acupuncture therapy may be allowable under this service category only when, as part of a substance use disorder treatment program funded under the RWHAP, it is included in a documented plan.

RWHAP funds may not be used for inpatient detoxification in a hospital setting, unless the detoxification facility has a separate license.
